




What is the difference between wood carving and whittling? The two main distinctions are apparent in the dictionary definition of the two terms. To whittle, Webster's dictionary says, is "to cut or shape wood by slowly paring it with a knife." Wood carving is "the art of fashioning or ornamenting objects of wood by cutting with a sharp implement held in the hand." Thus, while whittling is usually limited to the use of a knife; wood carving is not; wood carving is considered an art, while whittling is not."
