All members in good standing are allowed to vote for their choice for Carver-of-the-Year at the December meeting.

Snowman arms can be fashioned from small twigs and glued into holes drilled in the sides. Short arms are less likely to break off than long spindly ones. Coal eyes and buttons are made from sections of dowel or toothpicks that are inset and glued leaving about a sixteenth of an inch above the surface. This is a little easier than relief carving the coal into the surface. The same technique is used for the carrot nose The color pattern on the scarf and hat is done with the flattened end of a toothpick dipped into the paint and dabbed. The smaller dots are done with the toothpick's pointed end.

This amazing carved piece titled "Turkey Katsina" is in the Goldwater Collection at the Heard Museum of Native Cultures and Art in Phoenix, Ariz. The carving is about 12-14 inches tall with a wing span of about 18-20 inches. At the right is a miniature katsina that was about 3 inches tall. Traditionally katsina dolls (also spelled kachina) are carved from cottonwood root with fur and feathers added as needed. Modern figures can be assembled from several pieces, as above, and have realistic human proportions and movement.
